



The Bulls are Back on the Game Range

Have you ever wondered how many bull elk there might be if they all showed up on the winter range at once?

Well, maybe we've lived to

Because last week's helicopter survey of elk on the Blackfoot-Clearwater Game Range was one for the record books. We saw and counted 173 antlered bulls, surpassing the previous high count (in 1996) by

This is exciting enough. But, it's heart stopping to consider that the count of 66 spikes was good, but not unprecedented, and the count of 14 raghorns (mostly 2-year-old bulls) was on the low side of an average survey.

That's right. The difference between this year's and every other year's bull count was in the number of bulls that we judged by their antlers to be at least 3 years old. If you focus only on these older bulls, our count of 93 smashed the previous record of 59 that was set in 1998, and more than doubled any other previous count.

And, the bulls were big. Very big.

We didn't need any "paper" bulls to obtain an observed ratio of 29 bulls per 100 cows. But, when we applied our computer model to correct for biases in our ability to find bulls and cows, we estimated a "true" ratio of 31 bulls per 100 cows.

Actually, the computer didn't make many elk at all this year. We counted a grand total of 961 elk in about 10 hours of flight time on January 6th and 7th, but were only able to raise the official estimate to 990 by running the data through the computer model that we customized for the Game Range in the late 1980s. The graph on this page allows you to compare this year's estimates with those of years past.

The question is, where did all these big bulls come from?

Judging by the survey data from 2001, they surely came from somewhere besides the raghorns and older bulls we saw last winter, even if we pretend that hunters killed none last fall. And, unless you believe that big bulls are born in cabbage patches, and that it was a very good season in the cabbage patch to boot, there's only one reasonable explanation.

Yes, there was an unusual reshuffling of mature bull elk across their winter habitats in parts of the Blackfoot and Clearwater drainages this year. Our helicopter survey happened to take place in the right place at the right time.

We've had an inkling of this for some time, as have many of you. In the late 1980s and early 1990s, when many of your elk were decorated with molded PVC collars and emitting radio signals to Mark Hurley, John Grant, Ross Baty, Mike Barton, Dave Dickson and myself, we occasionally captured bulls on the Game Range and documented their failure to return in one or more subsequent years.

In one case that I remember

from personal experience, we found a radioed 2-year-old bull wintering in deep snow on top of a high ridge overlooking Shanley Creek. Despite the advantage of having a radio receiver and antenna in the helicopter with us, we couldn't make that bull nor his unmarked companions, if any, expose themselves to us, even after about 30 minutes of effort. But, we later confirmed that he was alive and well. He continued to range with the rest of the Blackfoot-Clearwater herd. He, like many other bulls, just didn't always come clear to the Game Range every year to spend the


ever decided to make the trip.

Blackfoot-Clearwater Game Range--Hunting District 282





Jamie Jonkel offered the best theory I've heard so far. He suggested that we blame last summer's fires in the backcountry. It's possible that the fires brought more bulls out of the Wilderness and high country earlier this fall, and the early deep snow may have given some of them an extra boost toward the Game Range. By the

bulls that remained in hiding at the upper elevations would have had no trouble ambling down to the lower winter range this year.

Whatever the reason, it was a treat to get a glimpse of yet

another of nature's secrets. We elk we have in our area, but this year we know there are many more than we've ever counted


