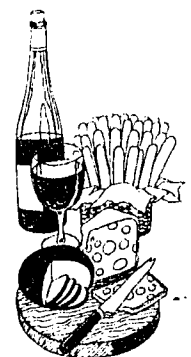

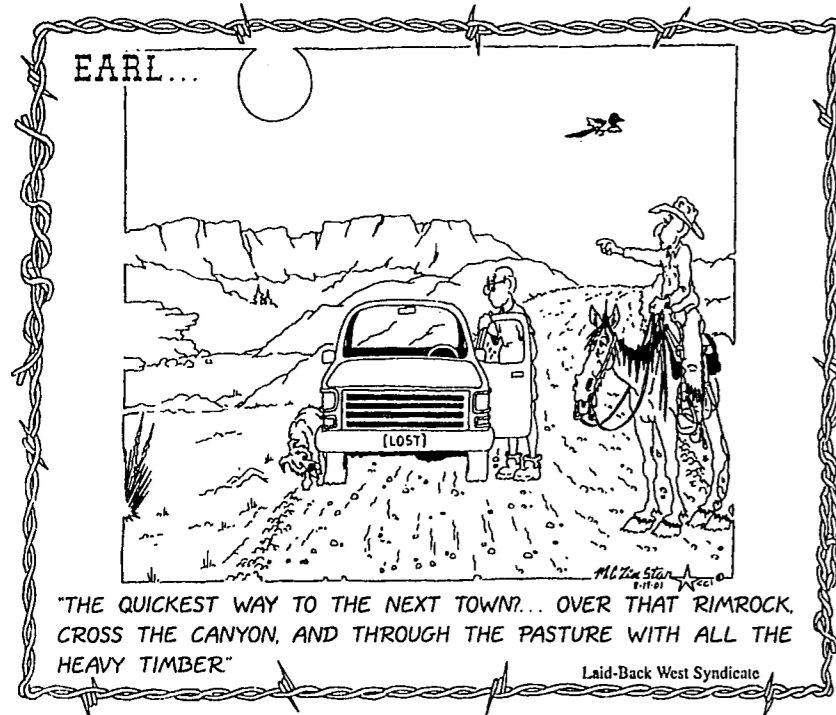

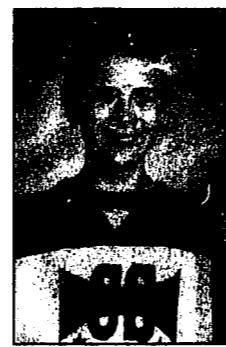
Editorial Comment

Charlo and Cascade finish at top in SSS Invitational

Charlo took the girls team title and Cascade the boys' division at the Seeley Invitational in Missoula last Friday.

For SSS boys, who finished in ninth place, Zach Nelson earned the only first place when he took the 800 in 2:13.69. Cody Hard finished third in the 200 (24.41), third in the long jump (19-0), and fifth in the triple jump (38-8). The relay team was fifth in the 1,600 relay (3:58.55).

Abbie Christianson earned a first for SSS girls, who finished in fifth place, with a javelin toss of 117-5. Beth Copenhaver finished fourth in the 300 hurdles (52:15), and fifth in the 200 (29:04). Christie Sullivan was sixth in the 1,600 in 6:51.37. Jesse Diamond was third in the high jump at 4-8, and the girls' relay team took third in the 400 (56.94) and fourth in the 1,600 relay (4:43.70).

"The Magnificent Seven," the seven mushers who participated in the 2002 1,100 mile Alaska Iditarod Sled Dog Race, will be in Lincoln for the 2nd Annual Iditarod Day on April 13, at the Historic Community Hall. The celebration starts at 2:00 p.m., after a 1:30 press conference.

The seven area mushers who participated in this year's race are Doug Swingley, Daniel Vetsch, Harmony Kanavle and Jason Barron of Lincoln; Jim Gallea of Seeley Lake; John Barron of Helmville, and Karen Land from Sand Coulee.

Several hundred people from around the state came to Lincoln for last year's Iditarod Day, which honored four-time winner Doug Swingley. Swingley will be on hand this year and will have last year's poster available for his autograph.

A Grizzly along the Blackfoot Already

It's tempting to think of the large male grizzly bear that appeared on a Helmville-area ranch last week as an early riser, especially with the slow spring we've experienced. Actually, he's right on schedule.

The average alarm clock goes off on April 11 in grizzly bear dens along the Swan Range. That's according to a study of 30 radio-collared bears on the northern edge of the Bob Marshall Wilderness Area by Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks researchers Rick Mace and John Waller from 1987 through 1994.

And, it's no coincidence that this first grizzly to make its presence known this spring in a rancher's bone yard along the Blackfoot River, not far downstream from Aunt Molly Wildlife Management Area, is an adult male. Mace and Waller also reported that the average adult male denned for a shorter period each winter (148 days), while adult females with cubs denned the longest on the average (177 days). So, it's not surprising to find that adult males emerged from their dens earliest on the average (April 2), and females with cubs emerged latest (April 21).

We have no way of knowing how long our local bruin has been suffering with his insomnia, but he would have had to get up pretty early this spring to set any records. The earliest emergence of a grizzly from its den in Mace and Waller's seven-year study was March 13. And, it was an adult male, of course.

There is one thing, however, that might set the Helmville grizzly apart from your average bear. You see, even though adult males emerge from their dens earlier in the spring than

adult females, they don't really go anywhere or do anything for quite awhile. Men, I'm sorry for the strife that this statement might cause in your household, but Mace and Waller were compelled to report the truth. In fact, adult male grizzlies remained in the vicinity of their dens for an average of 17 days after first emergence, longer than any other sex and age class.

This only makes the Helmville grizzly unusually ambitious if it has already traveled quite a ways from its den site to reach its current feeding area. The law of averages tells us that this bear probably did not den in the low country along the Blackfoot River. Bears in the Swan Range denned at an average of 6,100 feet in elevation, usually on very steep slopes not far from the nearest ridgetop. Grizzlies tend to seek out deep snow zones for insulation and, probably, security for hibernation.

You might be right if you suggested that the northern Swan Range is a poor model for predicting den sites that bears in the Blackfoot Valley might use. Maybe grizzlies that forage on the expansive flatlands along the Blackfoot River den in habitats that differ markedly from those of bears that never poke their noses out of the Swan Range. Maybe our Blackfoot bears den in places more like those selected by grizzlies that roam the plains along the Rocky Mountain Front, near Choteau.

Fortunately, FWP researchers Keith Aune and Wayne Kasworm studied grizzly bears along the Rocky Mountain Front from 1981-1989, and located 70 dens. The lowest elevation at which a den was located was 5,100 feet, and the average was 7,055 feet. They reported that 95% of the dens were above 6,200 feet, and all

others were located in remote country west of the Continental Divide, far from the plains where many grizzlies foraged at other times of the year.

Odds are that this bear near Helmville is indeed a bear of considerable interest to FWP managers and the local community. Because if it climbed out of a distant, snow-covered winter bed as early as it must have to shake off its lingering stupor and already make the trip to the Blackfoot, it probably had something on its mind. Possibly, something like the past experience of dead cows, horses and road-killed deer. There is probably no more effective way for a grizzly to begin recovering condition in the early spring than to feed on carrion.

Bears with this idea are much of the reason why FWP has assigned Jamie Jonkel to perform the duties of "Bear Management Specialist" in the Blackfoot watershed, including the Clearwater, and why the Forest Service and other organizations are contributing funding toward his efforts. These are some of the bears that scavenge on roadsides and ranches, and may come into conflict with people.

This is not Jamie's first time around the block with a bear of this ilk. When he worked with grizzlies in

Yellowstone National Park years ago, Jamie says he knew of a big male that would emerge in February and plow through the 8-foot snowpack to prey on elk that were doing the same. It was Yellowstone's version of a Blackfoot boneyard.

Now, just because our bear was in the Helmville area last week, that doesn't mean it won't be near Ovando or Seeley Lake this week or next. We just don't know. And, it's because we don't know enough that Jamie is working with local landowners to capture and radio-collar this bear.

The idea is not to move it. In fact, if the bear is caught, it will be released at the capture site, beside the bone yard that it already discovered for itself. At this writing, FWP has no information to suggest that the bear has killed livestock or poses an unusual threat to people.

Maybe this Helmville-area bear was the first grizzly in the Blackfoot Valley this year, or maybe it was just the first one that showed itself to us. Regardless, we will soon be aware of several others. Now is the time to re-instate your good habits of keeping a clean yard, a clean camp, and a can of pepper spray on your hip while hiking.

them that they never want to come back to this place again. With the radio collar in place, Jamie will be able to find the bear periodically thereafter, and learn how it responds. Hopefully, this information will allow FWP to prevent conflicts in the future, by providing FWP with opportunities to continue the bear's "hard" education, if necessary, and to identify garbage and other situations that attract bears to humans.

Jamie's work on reducing attractants is expanding. For the third successive year, he is collecting livestock carcasses from cooperating ranchers to retire boneyards in areas of potential conflict. It is not at all clear how the bears will respond as these traditional sources of early spring food are removed. Which is all the more reason to have a few of them radio-collared.

Instead, FWP's purpose is to teach this bear a lesson and monitor its response. If Jamie is successful in catching this bear, he will first radio-collar it, and then perform what is known as a "hard release." The idea, as practiced with promising results by FWP on nuisance bears in the Kalispell region, is to pepper the bear's butt with rubber bullets and the like to teach



If the protested application is for a

transfer of ownership not involving a transfer of location, the grounds for protest are limited to those set out in section 16-4-405, MCA. Protest letters that do not provide the information described in this paragraph will not be considered valid protest letters. Only those grounds for protest raised in valid protest letters will be considered at hearing. An individual's testimony will be limited to the grounds for protest raised in that individual's valid protest letter. If the Department receives a sufficient number of protests to trigger a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(a), MCA, a hearing will be scheduled in Helena, Montana. If the Department receives a sufficient number of protests to trigger a hearing pursuant to section 16-4-207(4)(b), MCA, to determine public convenience and necessity, a hearing will be held in the county in which the proposed premises is located. All qualified protesters will be notified of the time, date and location of the hearing. Hearings are typically scheduled within 90 days following the protest deadline.

If a sufficient number of protests to trigger a hearing are not received and all licensing criteria have been satisfied, the Department may issue the license without holding a hearing.

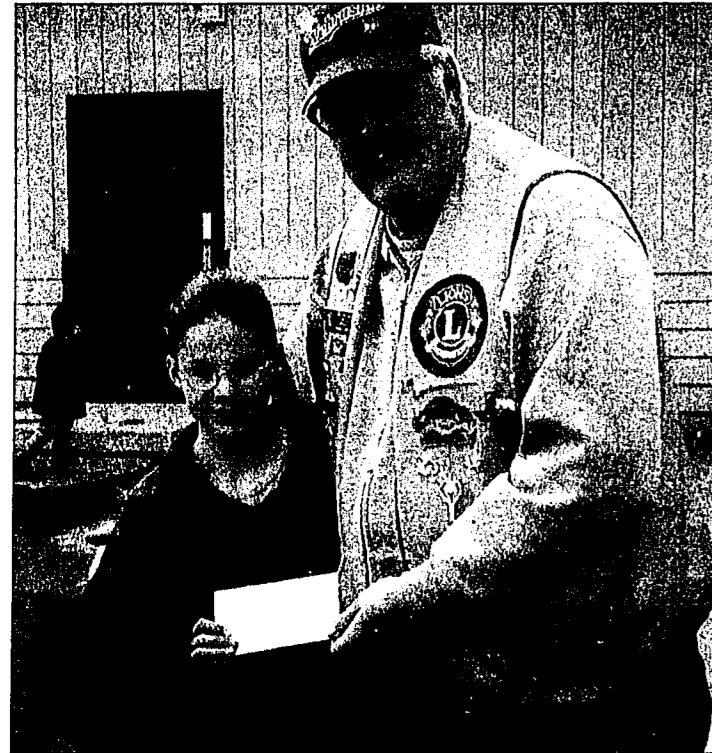
I thought it was scary and that the terrorists might attack again, and kill a ton more people. I was scared that my family might get hurt. I wished it had never happened.
